



Also known as Chinese Wolfberry. It is supposed to be high in antioxidants. I have room for a shrub of this size in my yard. I plan to order it from a nursery in the state of Washington when it becomes available. If you have space in a sunny part of your yard, you may want to consider a few blueberry bushes. They can be planted in a container so a paved area would be OK. They require an acid soil so that means a lot of peat moss in the mix. Another requirement is that the soil must be kept damp.... I have been growing "volunteer" cherry tomatoes this summer. It has good size with good flavor. 

Tuna Canyon was originally a Civilian Conservation Corp Camp before December 7, 1941. That night, an order went out by US Secretary of State, Frances Biddle," to arrest or cause the arrest of aliens" on an

ABC list. Immediately twelve foot high fences with barbed wires and search lights were installed and armed guards took over the CCC camp and it became a prison. More than 2000 Japanese, Germans, Italians, and Japanese civilians from Peru were housed on what is now the Verdugo Hills Golf Course in Tujunga.

Despite the recent delay of the case between Snowball West and the City of Los Angeles, the Coalition has applied for a Japanese American Confinement Sites grant from the National Parks Service. The goal is to build a museum quality traveling exhibit called, "Only the Oaks Remain." We need to collect oral histories and respectfully request your help. Contact Nancy Oda at nancyoda64@gmail.com. Should the HCM designation be removed, the Tuna Canyon Detention Station Coalition will reapply for Historic Cultural Monument status.
